CURRICULUM FOCUS

Five in a Row

Volumes 1-8 form the core of FIAR's elementary and middle school curriculum, providing inspired learning through great books at every level. Each unit is based on a children's picture book (Volumes 1-5) or a chapter book (Volumes 5-8), drawing high-interest, ageappropriate lessons that cover Social Studies, Language Arts, Art, Applied Math and Science. In Volumes 1-3, your student will spend one week of study per unit; in Volumes 4-5, picture book studies will take two weeks.

Chapter book studies in Volumes 5-8 will vary in length depending on your student's needs. One of the hallmarks of the Five in a Row curriculum is its flexibility, so the amount of time spent per unit, and per volume, may vary from family to family. These volumes cover Social Studies, Science, Language Arts, Fine Arts and Life Skills.

Interest-based, discussion-based and play-based learning techniques are utilized throughout FIAR to capture your student's attention and increase retention of the material. This makes it ideal for all learning styles!



LEWIS & CLARK UNIT STUDIES*

2nd-6th grade Literature, Art and Science

Over these five weeks, students will read and discuss "Lewis and Clark: The Missing Peace Medals," written by local author, Holly VanDyne, and illustrated by Audrey VanDyne. This chapter book follows stowaway, Alexander Payne, as he makes discoveries, learns about the wilds of America, and maybe even saves the day!

Just like Alexander, students will begin a nature journal, study native plants and animals and improve their drawing and painting skills.

Registered students will be provided an eagle backpack along with a copy of "The Missing Peace Medals," a blank nature journal and a travel set of colored pencils.

TELLING AMERICA'S STORY

THREE WORKSHOPS, THREE PROFESSORS, THREE DOCUMENTS, ONE STORY.

June 18, 1:30 - 2:30 p.m. "The Declaration of Independence" *

Described by Thomas Jefferson as "an expression of the American mind," "The Declaration of Independence" is a unique document that lays out the fundemental ideas that shape our country. In this workshop, Dr. Cara Rogers-Stevens will lead a discussion of these key priciples and help students grasp the revolutionary ideas the document contains.

July 9, 1:30 - 2:30 p.m. "The Gettysburg Address" *

Why does Lincoln refer to the equality of all men as a "proposition" rather than the "self-evident truth" of the Declaration of Independence? In this workshop, Dr. Jason Stevens will help students grapple with this and other questions about Lincoln's famous speech.

July 25, 1:30 - 2:30 p.m. "I Have a Dream" Speech *

This workshop will discuss MLK Jr's "I Have a Dream" Speech and the understanding of America that it expresses. Dr. Greg McBrayer will help students find answers to questions like "Why does MLK refer to the Declaration of Independence as a "promissory note" to all Americans?" and "What is MLK's vision of America?"

WINGS OF GLORY

July 19, 1 - 3 p.m. Wings of Glory is a table-top game that allows players to recreate aerial combat during World War I, using cards and miniatures to represent the airplanes and their maneuvers. Players will control one or more airplanes, taking to the skies to engage their opponents in aerial duels, or trying to accomplish a specific mission, such as recon, escort, or bombing. AU History professor, Dr. John Moser, will lead players as they make history come alive. Limited to 15 students
