

The Career Center for Life Calling, in conjunction with the College of Business & Economics, hosted the annual Meet the Accountant Night event on September 4th. Seventeen (17) employers - from the public, corporate, government, and nonprofit accounting and finance sectors were present to not only recruit AU students for summer internships, but also full and part time positions. This year's event brought in 46 students, first-year through MBA students, who built their personal brand with employers such as The J.M. Smucker Co., Rea & Associates, Inc., Meaden & Moore and many more, but also left with gained confidence in future networking opportunities with employers. Of note, twenty-one (21) AU and COBE alums were in attendance as recruiters on behalf of their employer.
